Both a popular garden plant and houseplant, begonia (*Begonia* spp.) is grown for its attractive heart-shaped leaves in a variety of colors and patterns, as well as its decorative flowers. Poisonous to cats and dogs if ingested, the toxic principle is soluble calcium oxalates, which are more concentrated in the underground tubers than the leaves and stems.
